With the end of the school summer term approaching, many of us will be looking forward to escaping that to-do list and go on holiday, maybe dreaming of peace and quiet, relaxing in the sun, having adventures and time with the family. So, we pack optimistically and hope everything goes as planned; but as anyone who has travelled knows, things don't always go to plan!

Jesus' journey in Luke 8:26-29 was not exactly the relaxing break his disciples might have been hoping for. No sooner had they crossed the lake, then they found themselves in a graveyard faced with a man who was possessed by demons. But from this rather unsettling welcome comes a moment of deep transformation. Jesus meets the man in his suffering, banishes the demons and restores him. Despite the man asking Jesus if he can join his followers, Jesus sends the man home to tell of what God has done for him. A travel destination that began in chaos became a mission of healing and grace.

Hopefully, our own travels will not involve any dramatic exorcisms, but they do hold the potential for unexpected moments and encounters. A flat tyre, a missed connection or a less-than-ideal Airbnb may test our patience - but these disruptions can also open us up to something deeper. Like Jesus, are we willing to be interrupted, to see beyond our plans and into the lives and needs of others?

Sometimes, the most memorable part of the holiday isn't the sights or the food, but the people we meet- or the stories we bring home (like the time my luggage didn't get to Spain by the same route that I did). Travel can teach us and soften our hearts, and if we are paying attention, bring us closer to God's work in the world.

So, as we travel this summer whether it's halfway across the world or a day trip to Skegness, I hope that we carry with us, curiosity, kindness, and a little flexibility (maybe take a few extra snacks just in case). As we return home, I hope that we bring back more than just souvenirs – like the man across the lake - that we bring back stories of your love and grace.
