In our busy lives, it is important to take a moment to appreciate the things that truly matter. We warmly invite you to be part of our cherished communities and to experience the awe, the beauty, the joy, the kindness and the hospitality found in 118 of our amazing churches and chapels.

The first weekend takes place in the east of the area and there really is something to see and do for everyone. Where will you start? The George Gilbert Scott Saxby All Saints? The outstanding 12th century black Tournai font at Thornton Curtis, St Lawrence? Or perhaps Immingham, St Andrew with its links to the Mayflower Pilgrims?

James Fowler's Victorian Early English style masterpiece Binbrook, St Mary & St Gabriel and Riby, St Edmund will offer spire and tower tours with rare behind the scene access to clocks, bells, and magnificent views. On the Saturday there is a Teddy bear parachuting event for all the family, where bears can parachute from the church tower at Cadney, All Saints. The very popular 'Value It! Flog It?' and Riby Ramble 4 mile walk also return to Riby, St Edmund. Normanby le Wold would like your help completing jigsaws for all ages at their jigsaw festival.

Claxby, St Mary will be launching a new trail leaflet to guide you around a series of



local churches. Listen to the tunes of Joshua Gibbons a papermaker and learn about papermaking 200 years ago at Tealby, All Saints. See the original 18th century Tyrwhitt tapestries at Stainfield, St Andrew a beautiful Queen Anne church. Listen to an engaging talk on the history behind the divine Southrey, St John the Divine.

Explore the open towers of Kirton in Lindsey, St Andrew, and Scotter, St Peter during the second weekend. Consider a pilgrimage to Hibaldstow, St Hybald the resting place of the 7th century Anglo-Saxon saint. Discover the Crowle Stone in Crowle, St Oswald. Visit the Minster Church of St Mary, Stow for a stunning blend of Saxon and Norman

architecture. In Coates by Stow, St Edith, take a seat in the pews and admire the rood screen and loft Henry's men overlooked. Later look for the stairs to nowhere in other churches.

Don't miss the recently restored 17th century Monson Monument at South Carlton, St John the Baptist. Finally, appreciate the beautiful Victorian Gothic Hackthorn, St Michael & All Angels, featuring exquisite woodwork and set in tranquil parkland. If you are looking for a peaceful place for reflection, choose one of the churches that have identified themselves as quiet churches.

Once again, we thank you for your support. We would not be here celebrating our 30th birthday if you did not return year after year ensuring this is still one of the biggest and best Churches Festivals in Europe.

Glossary of terms

AISLE

In a church the aisles are generally the areas to the north and south of the nave, separated from it by an arcade.

ALTAR

The table located in the east end of the church at which Holy Communion (the eating of bread and drinking of wine in accordance with the instructions of Jesus at the Last Supper) is celebrated.

ANGLO-SAXON

(7th century to 1066) Saxon architecture is characterised by thick walls, with very thin, rounded windows, and masonry arranged at corners in an alternating 'long-short' pattern.

ARCADE

A series of connected arches.

AUMBREY

Small cupboard in a church wall, historically used for storing items used in communion.

BOX PEW

A pew with high sides of equal height entered by a door, typical of the 18th century.

CAPITAL

The carved head of a pillar or column.

CHANCEL

The east end of the church containing the altar.

CLERESTORY

An upper storey composed only of windows.

CUPOLA

A small dome forming a roof or ceiling.

DECORATED GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE

(c1250-c1350) Decorated Gothic is the second phase of English Gothic architecture. As the name suggests it is richly and elaborately embellished with carvings and, originally,

paintwork. Characteristic features include complex curving and geometric tracery to windows, and the use of an 'ogee' arch (an arch which curves inwards and then outwards).

EARLY ENGLISH GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE

The first phase of Gothic architecture in this country is known as Early English. Buildings from throughout the period c1170-c1250 often fall within this stylistic framework. It is typified by 'lancet' windows (tall, narrow, single-opening windows which come to a single point with no internal divisions), pointed arches, stiff-leaf capitals, and ribbed vaulting.

FONT

Often in the form of a basin mounted on a pedestal; used for the baptism of children and adults.

GEORGIAN

The period 1714-1837, which includes the reign of William IV (1830-1837).

GOTHIC

Art and architecture of the mid to late medieval period (12th to 16th centuries). Gothic architecture appeared first in France in the 1140s. It is traditionally characterised by pointed arches. These arches distribute weight more efficiently, allowing taller, lighter and more spacious buildings.

GOTHIC REVIVAL

A style of architecture and design, beginning around the middle of the eighteenth century and attaining enormous popularity in the 19th century, that emulates the 'pointed' architecture of the 12th to 16th centuries.

HATCHMENT

Large, diagonal plaque with a deceased person's heraldic arms, carried at the funeral and then hung in the church.

Glossary of terms

MEDIEVAL

The period of European history between the fall of the Roman Empire and the Renaissance (5th to 16th centuries).

NAVE

The main body of the church, usually from the West door to the chancel, excluding any aisles. The nave belongs to the people and comes from the Latin term 'naves' meaning boat, reflecting the ark of Noah which protected God's people.

NEO-CLASSICAL

Art and architecture which emulates the styles of Ancient Greece and Rome, most prevalent in English churches in the 17th to 19th centuries.

NORMAN ARCHITECTURE

The Romanesque architecture which arrived in England with the Norman Conquest (1066 to the late 12th/early 13th centuries).

PASCHAL

Relating to Easter.

PERPENDICULAR GOTHIC

(c1340-16th century) During the late 14th century, English gothic architecture became more vertical and linear. The term 'Perpendicular' highlights the use of rectangular panels rather than the flowing tracery of the Decorated period. Most Perpendicular architecture can be identified by repetitive thin vertical panels used in windows, masonry, and in the striking 'fan vaulting' developed at this time.

PIETA

A picture or sculpture of the Virgin Mary holding the dead body of Christ on her lap or in her arms.

PISCINA

A basin set within the wall near to an altar, used in medieval services to wash the utensils of the mass and the hands of the priest.

POPPYHEAD

Carved ornament of leaves, often fleur-de-lys, on pew ends.

PULPIT

An enclosed platform from which sermons may be preached. These gained in popularity and significance following the Reformation.

REREDOS

A painted or sculpted screen covering the wall behind and above an altar.

ROMANESQUE

The architecture of the late 10th to late 12th centuries. Though emulating the Christian architecture of Rome it is not a 'Classical' style. Typical features include rounded arches and thick-wall construction.

ROOD SCREEN

An open-work screen separating the nave from the chancel and supporting a large cross (called a 'Rood' by the Anglo-Saxons).

SEDILIA

Seating set within the wall near to an altar for use by ministers during mass, often elaborately carved.

TRACERY

The web of stonework found in a window.

TRANSEPT

In cruciform (cross-shaped) churches, transepts are the areas that extend to the north and south immediately before the chancel.

TUDOR

From 1485-1603.

VICTORIAN

The period from 1837-1901.



CHURCH DETAILS

St Andrew's, built in 1871 and set in a quiet and well kept churchyard. It looks like an ordinary little church on the outside, but this quaint little gem is a must see! The church was originally built as a mortuary chapel and has since been consecrated. Visitors will receive a warm welcome together with complimentary fruit juice and light refreshments.

CHURCH DETAILS

There is an exhibition of stones which were exhumed from Bardney Abbey in the early 1900s. The chancel is decorated with pictures of saints. There are also some 17th century charity boards. The church has connections with the RAF's 9th Squadron. There has recently been a stained glass window dedicated to them. Organist Paul Savage 2pm-3pm both days. Huge plant stall, a tombola and craft stall.

CHURCH DETAILS

The church was built in 1926/27 to replace the existing wooden church and be more central than the 11th century St Mary's which is sited on the edge of the village. It was unfinished as money ran out! Beautiful coloured ceiling painted in railway colours. Refreshments served over the weekend. Exhibition on "History of Barnetby" during the weekend.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Mary's dates back to the 11th century and is mentioned in the Domesday Book. It was extended in the 14th century with a tower with three bells that were made locally in Grasby. Outside on the south wall is a stone carving of a cat above one of the windows. The church is no longer used for worship and now looked after by The Churches Conservation Trust. It is on the edge of the village within the church graveyard. Exhibition of its history during the weekend.

CHURCH DETAILS

Our church built in 1869 is architect James Fowler's Victorian gothic masterpiece - The Cathedral of the Wolds. It is completely as he envisaged and his beautiful original plans and illustrations will be on display. We will offer tours up the impressive spire and the bells can be rung from the Ellacombe system. The long association with RAF Binbrook is evident in the church and Commonwealth War Graves are looked after in the extensive cemetery.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Andrew's church dates from 1100's possibly built on an earlier wooden building. Undergoing various renovations throughout its life. Norman, Medieval, Georgian and Victorian periods are clearly evidenced in the building itself. Originally linked to St Fromond's in France, now part of Lincoln Diocese, Yarborough Deanery. It has 3 bells which are chimed on a regular basis, the oldest is dated from the 1400's and the other 2 are from the tower restoration of 1724.

CHURCH DETAILS

No bell tower, no cemetery, but ample car parking space, heating and toilets. Not the typical Lincolnshire church. Brookenby Church has its home in a former accommodation block of the former RAF Binbrook. This is also home of the Angels Tearoom and Thrift shop, which is run by a group of enthusiastic volunteers. We are planning to hold an exhibition of local art work created by residents of Brookenby.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Michael's Church stands framed by the large trees surrounding the part-moated farm to the east. This church is one of the few remaining buildings remaining on the site of a deserted Medieval village. Apart from its square tower, the church was rebuilt in brick in 1835. Unassuming outside, it hides treasures within: two extraordinary fourteenth-century monuments to the local De Buslingthorpe family.

CHURCH DETAILS

Cabourne St Nicholas is of Saxon Foundation. Saxon features are Tower, grave markers & font. A Norman doorway is on the North Side. The Tower door has been extensively repaired, and a new key made for the Victorian lock. The floor is of Muhuhu wood and was laid in the 1960s. Our exhibition is Lincolnshire Past, Church Registers and Lincoln Longwool Sheep, which brought so much wealth to the county.

CHURCH DETAILS


This little roadside church is the thirteenth-century chancel of a larger church which was a ruin until 1889, when the chancel was gently restored and a west porch added. Inside you can see a fourteenth-century stone slab with an incised cross and chalice commemorating a priest, and Latin inscriptions in praise of the Virgin Mary adorn the wooden ceiling. A fine font and pews have been rescued from other historic churches. Please take care when parking and crossing the road.

CHURCH DETAILS

Come & celebrate what we have done, enjoy coffee & cake in our new seating area, the church tower has been enhanced to contain a servery and a new disabled access WC has been added sympathetically to the church. But the beauty of the 14th century restored church remains set in an oasis of peace. The font is decorated with instruments of The Passion, the pulpit is metal in the arts & crafts style, made by Christopher Turner. There are fragments of early glass & a 20th century window by Edward Payne.

CHURCH DETAILS

All Saints sits in a commanding position in the village. The church was extensively restored in the 19th century by Revd Charles Tennyson Turner, brother of poet laureate Alfred Lord Tennyson. Memorial to Charles and his wife Louisa. The east window is particularly attractive. An embroidery exhibition by local embroiderers and other attractions.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Peter's is a Grade I listed building is situated within the conservation area of Great Limber. First built in the 12th century there have been several additions and alterations over the years. IN the churchyard, there are Commonwealth Graves, and the Community Orchard stands adjacent to the grounds. The lychgate built in 1912 is the main entrance to the churchyard. To the west of the building is a square tower with a battlement parapet.

CHURCH DETAILS

A church of Anglo-Saxon origins rebuilt in the 13th & 14th centuries and sympathetically restored in the 19th century. The spire was suggested by Capability Brown when he redesigned the park. Inside, there is a "nationally important" series of absolutely stunning monuments to the Heneage Family. From brass of 1435 to modern memorials of 1954, in varying styles all relating to a time span of one family. Light refreshments available throughout the day.

CHURCH DETAILS

The church dates to the 13th century. It has exquisite stained glass, a very rare and beautiful mosaic and marble reredos, a carved rood screen and painted chancel ceiling. In 1259 its former vicar became Bishop of London.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Andrews Church is over 800 years old and its highlights include Norman arches, a beautiful east stained-glass window, a rare King James II coat of arms and links to the Mayflower Pilgrims. Opposite the church is a Pilgrim Fathers monument and information about the Pilgrim Walk. The churchyard holds war memorials, with further memorial plaques inside. 





Built in 1853 on the site of an earlier chapel, St Mark's is a lovely community church in a very small village that hosts many community events. There will be a special preview of the Vermuyden 400 years exhibition for the Rose Queen event on the 25th May 2026 to mark Charles I appointing Cornelius Vermuyden to drain parts of the Isle of Axholme. Local Boards showing Amcotts past and present on display. Local Boards showing the Flixborough Disaster and the forgotten village of Amcotts will also be on display. And a children's butterfly garden.

Despite the long history of Christian worship, the present church dates from 1866 (chancel) and 1875 (nave), and the tower was rebuilt in the 1960s. St Hybald's occasionally plays host to pilgrimages to see the relics of St Hybald.

The internationally renowned cruciform Anglo-Saxon Minster Church of St Mary dates to 975 AD, with a Norman chancel completed c. 1150 AD. Important features include Viking graffiti from 10th/11th century, 12th/13th century fresco of Thomas Beckett, and a 13th century font. Visit our exhibition of paintings (and some photographs) of the church by local artists and photographers past and present that show the building and its people. Enjoy the peace and quiet. 
