Revd Thomas writes...

In the last few years of parochial ministry, I was regularly asked by couples for a greater variety of readings at their weddings than the obligatory (boring) piece out of the Bible. Sometimes the text was close to their hearts but often, I feared, the gobbets were trawled from the internet. What I found so depressing about many of them is the banality of the sentiments about love especially compared with the profoundly powerful ones to be found in the Scriptures. This lack of confidence, or fear of the Christian sacred text saddens me. Why should the writings of Native Americans be more valued than St Paul? Why should a modern novelist living in Suffolk be as prized as St John?

When passages from the bible were chosen, rather than I Corinthians chapter 13, increasing numbers of couples opted for chapter 8 of the Song of Solomon. I encouraged couples to read (and enjoy!) that Old Testament poem in its entirety.

Apart from the numbers of weddings when we hear these words, they are read at Evensong during Easter Week. At the end of the great solemnities of the Paschal Triduum, we are able to contemplate not only the hope of love within marriage and other intimate loving human relationships, but the very core of the Christian faith - that death does not have the last word and that love, as revealed primarily in God's salvific work in the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead, trumps everything.
