### Lucílle writes...

"The Lord is My Shepherd" is the theme for this week's All Age Service. It is also the best known and best loved of all the psalms. While I have been focussing on the topic I have been reminded of the invaluable source of prayer material that these psalms provide. They are a rich compilation of powerful prayers, hymns and poems and they include every human emotion possible from anger, frustration, fear, loneliness and sadness to bliss, joy elation, wonder, gratitude and everything in between.

Whilst they were written in historic times, for specific circumstances, in our modern age we are stirred by the same emotions, beset by the same problems of life and cry out in need or worship to the same God as the psalmists of old. It is easy and comforting to identify with the sentiments expressed by the psalmists.

There are 150 psalms altogether and they are often grouped into 5 distinct categories: hymns in praise of God's character and deeds, community laments arising out of some national disaster, royal psalms originating in some special occasion in the life of the reigning king, individual laments and individual thanksgiving. 73 of these psalms concern the life and actions of David, and it is probable that he was the author of a good many of them.

We find many quotes from the psalms woven into our patterns of worship and indeed into our everyday lives. Many of the hymns we sing in church today are taken directly from the psalms, which is appropriate as many of them were originally designed to be sung. Finally, Jesus himself often quoted from the psalms, most notably as he hung on the cross he quoted from Psalm 22 when he cried out in anguish "My God, my God why hast thou forsaken me!"

There is a prayer for every occasion to be found in the psalms written in the most powerful and relatable language:

"I life up my eyes to the hills, From whence does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, Who made heaven and earth" The Lord will keep you from all evil; He will keep your life, The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in From this time forth and for evermore"
