Jenny wrítes...

In the church, it feels as if it has been a busy time of seasons and festivals. We had Lent and Passiontide, Easter, Ascension, and last week Pentecost. There has been a lot going on! This week is no different. On Sunday, we celebrate Trinity Sunday, where we come to think about the Triune nature of God. God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit. Three in One and One in Three. A God who is beyond all, in all and for all.

1,700 years ago, this year, a group of Christian leaders and theologians attempted to lay down the foundations of Christianity and a core understanding of who God is in the Nicene Creed, a Creed that millions of us stand up to proclaim each Sunday.
That Creed lays out the Trinity for all to see, declaring that "We Believe". Through it, we proclaim a belief in One God but recognise three aspects of that One God.
The Father Almighty, Creator of all things. The Lord Jesus Christ, come to earth to meet us in our joy and our sorrow, both fully human and fully divine. And the Holy

Spirit, the breath of God, giver of live, sent to dwell within us. We proclaim what we believe, but the truth is that our words and statements can never fully explain the unexplainable. The mystery of God will always be beyond our words, our imagination and our understanding. Even the Trinity as Father, Son and Holy Spirit can be expressed in many different ways. Creator, Redeemer,

Sustainer. Mother, Friend, Guide. Or, in St Augustine's ancient words, Lover, Beloved, Love.

How we name our God, or define His nature, doesn't really matter. What matters is that we are drawn into a relationship with a God who breathes life into us, who guides us, comforts us, restores us, and reconciles us to Him. Our God, Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Spirit, calls each one of us into this never-ending relationship with Him called Love.
